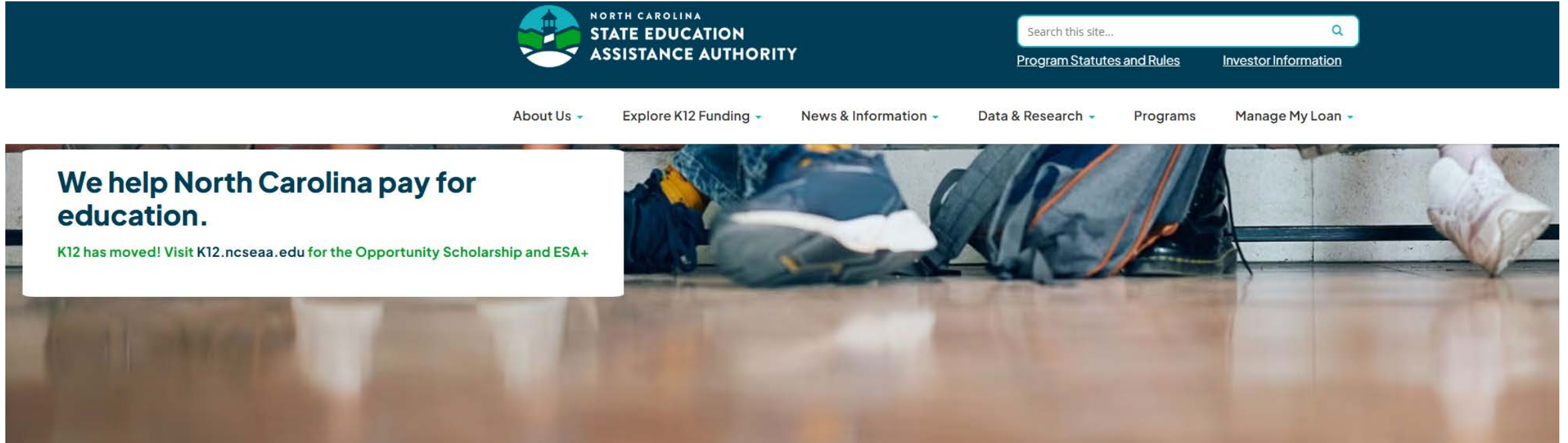

North Carolina State Education Assistance Authority



- NCSEAA, just SEAA, or “The Authority”
- Established in 1965
- State agency charged with administering financial aid programs for students: ***We help North Carolina pay for education.***
- Participates in the collaboration called “College for North Carolina” (CFNC) (formally “College Foundation of North Carolina”)

NCSEAA Website



NCSEAA – We Help North Carolina Pay for Education

- Promotes access to higher education
- Administrator of North Carolina's National College Savings Plan
- SARA-NC portal agency
- RDS-Residency Determination Service
- Administers numerous scholarship, grant, and loan programs at public four-year, public two-year, independent colleges and universities
- Administers State grants for parents sending children to private K-12 schools in NC
- Outreach and training activities for FAAs, school counselors, and the general public (via CFNC.org)

College Foundation, Inc. (CFI)



- Nonprofit chartered in 1955
- Purpose: assist students in financing cost of higher education
- Government-supporting organization; trustees appointed by the governor
- On Behalf of NCSEAA:
 - Administers a portfolio of alternative loans, State grant programs, and the 529 savings program
 - Administers the Residency Determination Service (RDS)
 - Provides technology services for CFNC.org and delivery of information to North Carolina students / families about paying for college
 - Administers the State Grant System used to certify private (NC Need-Based Scholarship) and public sector (Next NC Scholarship) scholarships

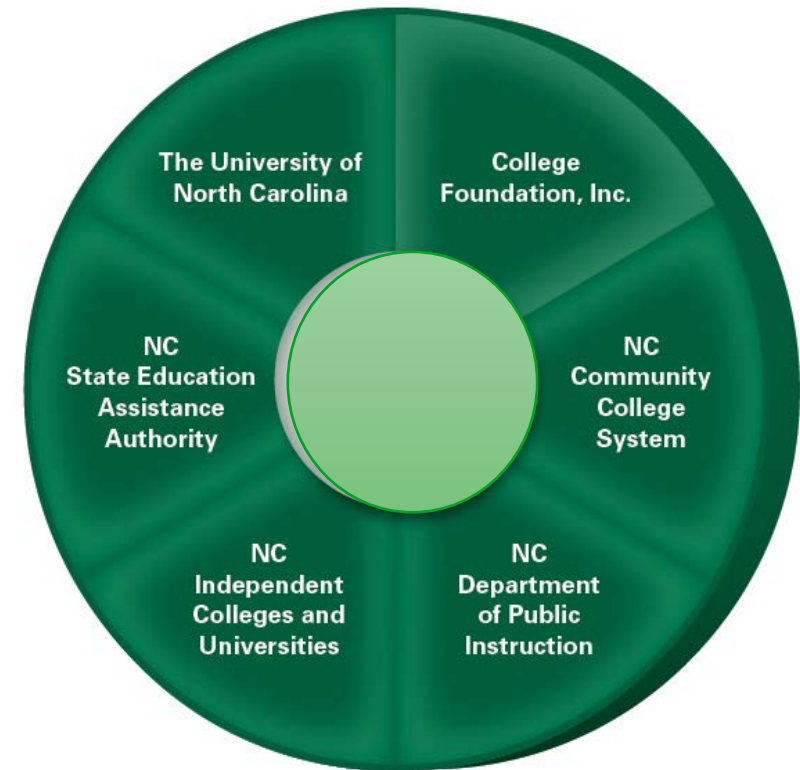

Common Elements of State Scholarships

Student Eligibility

- NC Resident per NC Residency Determination Service (RDS)
- Enrolled at least ½ time
- Undergraduate with no prior bachelor's degree
- Satisfactory Academic Progress
- Meet Pell eligibility criteria (except EFC/SAI and LEU)
- Has not exceeded the number of semesters funded state limitation
- Institutions may award a scholarship to an eligible student for each of one or more semesters, quarters, or terms in an academic year, provided that the student's total financial aid, including the Scholarship, does not exceed the student's Cost of Attendance.

Application Method

- FAFSA
 - June 1 Priority FAFSA Completion Date for UNC System Institutions
 - August 15 Priority FAFSA Completion Date for community colleges
 - Funding may be available for applicants who complete the FAFSA after these dates subject to funding availability.
 - As soon as possible for private colleges and universities; funds awarded until exhausted
- Summer funding provided, as a regular term award, began summer 2025

Non-resident Armed Forces Personnel and their Dependents

- Only NC residents per RDS are eligible for financial assistance from state financial aid programs.
- Certain non-resident members of the armed forces and their dependents, who do not qualify as NC residents, are eligible for in-state tuition rates
- Exception: Certain non-resident members of the armed forces and their dependents, who do not qualify as NC residents, may be eligible for the Need Based Scholarship (private institutions). Refer to specific guidance document for more information.

SCHOLARSHIP

Most NC students with $AGI \leq \$80K$ will qualify for at least \$5K to attend a UNC institution and \$3K to attend a NC community college

How it works:

- Combines federal Pell Grants and state funds to ensure students get at least the minimum awards of \$5,000 for UNC and \$3,000 for NCCCS
- Eligible students have $AGI \leq \$80,000$ and $SAI \leq \$7,500$
- More aid is available based on need



NC Need Based Scholarship

- Provides funding for students attending eligible **private** colleges and universities and nursing schools
- Eligible students have AGI $\leq$ \$160,000 and SAI $\leq$ \$15,000
- Minimum award of \$5,000 with more aid available based on need
- 2024-25 transitional payment schedule; formula beginning with 2025-26 to account for Pell/SAI changes and to mirror Next NC Scholarship



Funding Limits Established for State Programs

- Semester limits for state grants
 - Programs affected
 - Next NC Scholarship (Community Colleges & UNCs)
 - NC Need-Based Scholarship (Private Colleges & Universities)
 - Limits
 - 6 semesters (FTE) for a two-year degree program (CC program)
 - 10 semesters (FTE) for a four-year degree program
 - 12 semesters (FTE) for a five-year degree program
 - Across all programs: 10 semesters limit (12 semesters for five-year program)
 - Prorated if students are enrolled less than full-time
- Students can be eligible for full state aid regardless of the 600% Pell limitation.

Next NC Scholarship (Public) North Carolina Need Based Scholarship (Private) Institutional Responsibilities

- Institution executes a Participation Agreement (one-time), if required
- FAA certifies student eligibility online
 - cfnc.org/home/info_faa.jsp
 - Pell eligible except for SAI
 - NC resident per RDS
 - Correct enrollment status
 - Same ISIR transaction used for federal and state awards
- Apply funds to student accounts within ten days of disbursement
- Refund money within prescribed timeframes
 - Return funds when a student withdraws prior to or on the 35% point of the term
 - Calculate the return amount via the CFI Grant System
 - Return State grant funds within 60 days of the withdrawal date

- Maintain accurate records
- Be available for reviews and audits
- Comply with record retention requirements (if applicable) of five years from close of fiscal year or until all review findings and audit exceptions have been resolved



North Carolina's Forgivable Loans

NC Forgivable Education Loans for Service (FELS)

- Standards-based loan provides financial assistance to qualified students who are committed to working in North Carolina in identified critical employment shortage professions
 - Undergraduate and graduate students
- Target employment professions:

Nursing	Allied Health
Medicine	Teaching

- Students must be fully admitted to their areas of study in four-year programs
- Application Deadline: March 1 (Application opens after the 1st of January)

- Applications are entered into a lottery for award consideration

FELS – Rural NC Programs; Primary Care Physicians & Psychiatrists

In 2024-2025 Doctoral Degree Program for Primary Care Physicians and Psychiatrists – Rural NC was created

- These students who apply and are approved for the FELS Program must practice in-person primary care or psychiatry in an eligible NC county designated as a development tier one or tier two area in the annual ranking performed by the North Carolina Department of Commerce to qualify for loan forgiveness.
- **Primary care shall include the disciplines of family medicine, general pediatric medicine, general medicine, internal medicine/pediatrics, and obstetrics/gynecology.**

Credits	Doctoral Degree
Full-Time	\$25,000 (\$12,500/semester)
Part-time	\$12,500 (\$6,250/semester)
Maximum Primary Physician & Psychiatrist Rural NC Service Aggregate Total	\$100,000

FELS-Student Eligibility Requirements

A recipient must meet the following eligibility criteria to be considered for FELS:

- Be a legal NC resident
- Not be in default, or owe a refund, under any federal or State loan or grant
- Maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress according to the enrolling policy of the institution
- Enroll at least half time, according to the academic standards of the school, each semester to qualify for funding
- Be willing to work in NC in a designated critical employment field

FELS- Student Requirements



- Cumulative minimum grade point average (GPA):
 - **3.00** for graduating high school students (weighted GPA)
 - **2.80** for undergraduate students pursuing an associate or bachelor's degree
- Sign a promissory note
 - Generally, a loan for one academic year (+ interest) will be forgiven for one year of full-time employment in an approved qualified position
 - One loan will be forgiven for two years of part-time employment in an approved qualified position
 - Interest accrues at 7% per year from the date of disbursement
 - Maximum ten-year repayment – may be shorter term based on amount borrowed

FELS- How Much?



Annual Loan Amounts are as follows:

- Diploma, Certificate and/or associate degree programs: \$3,000
- Bachelor's degree program: (sophomores) \$3,000
- Bachelor's degree program: (juniors and seniors) \$7,000
- Master's degree program: \$10,000
- Doctoral degree program: \$14,000

Maximum Aggregate Loan Limits:

- Diploma, Certificate and/or associate degree programs: \$6,000
- Bachelor's degree program: \$20,000
- Graduate Certificate Programs \$20,000
- Master's degree program: \$20,000
- Doctoral degree program: \$56,000

Note: Recipients must be enrolled at least part-time each semester to qualify for funding. The award amount will be pro-rated according to number of credit hours. Priority is given to Junior & Seniors at the Bachelor's level.

North Carolina Teaching Fellows

Forgivable loan for service administered by UNC System Office, the NC Teaching Fellows Commission, and SEAA



- Student eligibility
 - Incoming freshmen, cc transfer students, current college students who decide to enter education field, & individuals seeking licensure only
 - Must attend ***Appalachian State University, East Carolina University, Elon University, Fayetteville State University, Meredith College, NC A&T University, NC State University, UNC-Chapel Hill, UNC-Charlotte, or UNC-Pembroke***
 - Must enroll in a Program leading to teacher licensure in STEM, Special Education, or Elementary Education
 - Must be at least part-time
- Loan is up to \$5,000 per semester/period of enrollment
 - Student signs promissory note
 - <https://myapps.northcarolina.edu/ncteachingfellows/>

North Carolina Principal Fellows

Forgivable loan for service administered by UNC System Office, the NC Principal Fellows Commission, and SEAA

- Student eligibility
 - Must attend ***Appalachian State University, North Carolina Central University, East Carolina University, North Carolina State University, The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, The University of North Carolina at Charlotte, The University of North Carolina at Greensboro, Western Carolina University***
 - Must be enrolled as a full-time student in the School Leader Preparations Program. (Full-time status is determined by the academic standards of the institution's School Leader Preparation Program.
 - Only tuition and fee charges can be covered by a Principal Fellows (PFP) award. Awards may not be applied to broader "cost of attendance" elements-i.e. transportation, childcare, etc., which would result in a student receiving a "refund" of any excess award amount based on the PFP award amount.
 - Meets the Minimum Academic Requirements as defined by the institution.
 - Is not in default, or does not owe a refund, under any federal or state loan or grant program, including any overpayments
 - Agrees to work in a Qualified Position in North Carolina
- Loan amount varies. It depends on the institution but cannot exceed \$40,000 for 2 years.
 - Student signs promissory note

National Board Certification Loan

Loan is administered by Department of Public Instruction and SEAA.

- Loan program that provides funding for teachers to achieve National Board Certification
- Loan Amount \$1900
- Repayment is cash
- There are 5 core components applicants must complete; When this program is completed, then the applicants receive a significant pay raise



Endowed Scholarship Programs – UNC Systems

Endowed Scholarship Programs-UNC System

- Each endowment has certain criteria
- The students become eligible through nominations from the institutions Financial Aid Office
- The number of students varies depending on institution
- Amount of award varies \$200-\$5500; it depends on the institution and endowment scholarship



North Carolina Scholarship Programs

Aubrey Lee Brooks Scholarship

- Established in 1955 by a Trust endowed by the late Aubrey Lee Brooks
- Awards made annually to seventeen (17) graduating NC high school seniors
- Eligibility:
 - Be a graduating North Carolina high school senior
 - Be a permanent resident of Alamance, Bertie, Caswell, Durham, Forsyth, Granville, Guilford, Orange, Person, Rockingham, Stokes, Surry, Swain or Warren county (NC)
 - Plan to enroll as a full-time undergraduate student at NC State University, UNC Chapel Hill or UNC Greensboro
 - Complete the FAFSA; SAI must be 12000 or less
(demonstrate financial need = Brooks plus other awards cannot exceed Cost of Attendance)

The North Carolina State Education Assistance Authority provides central administration for the Brooks Foundation

Aubrey Lee Brooks Continued. . .

- Value \$12,000/year (up to \$48,000 cumulative)
- One-time \$2,500 technology stipend
- Brooks Scholars may receive additional funding for summer school, internship, research or travel abroad participation
- The scholarship is renewable, provided the recipient has continued financial need, remains enrolled full-time at an eligible institution, and maintains a 2.75 cumulative grade point average and “good citizenship”.

Application opens on CFNC.org first Monday in January after the 1st & closes March 1

Golden LEAF Scholarship Programs

Golden LEAF Foundation provides two scholarship program

Golden LEAF Colleges and Universities Scholarship Program (Golden LEAF Scholarship)

- 4-Year UNC's and NC Private Colleges/Universities (58)
- Rising first-year (NC HS graduate) and NC community college transfer students
- Resident of qualifying NC counties (81)
- Overseen by NCSEAA

Golden LEAF Community College Scholarship

- NC Community Colleges (58)
- Resident of qualifying NC counties (94)
- Overseen by participating schools

Golden LEAF Colleges & Universities Scholarship (4-Year Institutions)

- Eligibility:
 - Be a NC resident for tuition purposes (confirmed via RDS);
 - Be a **NC high school senior** enrolling full-time as a first-year student or a currently enrolled **NC community college transfer** student enrolling full-time at a participating NC college or university;
 - Complete the FAFSA; SAI must be 15000 or less
 - Have a cumulative grade point average of at least a 2.5;
 - Be a resident of a qualifying rural county for at least 10 years.
 - demonstrate financial aid need (after awarding)
- Value \$3,500/year
 - up to \$14,000 cumulative – HS senior
 - up to \$10,500 cumulative – CC transfer student

Application opens on CFNC.org first Monday in January after the 1st & closes March 1

Emphasis on leadership development (Leadership & Internship Opportunities)



Golden LEAF Community College Scholarship

For eligible students attending NC community colleges

- **Curriculum**

- Be a North Carolina resident (RDS)
- Reside in a qualifying NC county
- Enrollment
 - Fall & Spring – be enrolled full-time, prorated awards possible for less than full-time based on enrollment and funding availability
 - Summer – be enrolled at least half-time (6 credit hours)
- Demonstrate financial need as determined by completion of the FAFSA

- **Workforce Continuing Education**

- Be a North Carolina resident (RDS not required)
- Reside in a qualifying NC county
- Be enrolled in Workforce Continuing Education (WCE) pathway leading to a state or industry-recognized credential

Golden LEAF Community College Scholarship

- Maximum Awards:

Curriculum Students: up to \$2,250 annually (including summer term)

Workforce Continuing Education Students: up to \$1,850 annually

Funds may be used for tuition, fees, books, supplies, credential exams, childcare and transportation expenses.

- Application procedure
 - Contact the college's financial aid office for more information on how to apply and deadlines.

NOTE: The Golden Leaf Scholarship awarded to a Community College student does not automatically transfer to the four-year school with the student. The student must reapply for the four-year institution scholarship.

UNC Campus Scholarships

- Established in 2002 by the NC General Assembly through the consolidation of several programs
- Provides funding for undergraduate and doctoral students
- Eligibility
 - Must be NC resident per RDS
 - Each campus drafted and submitted a plan to the President of the UNC System describing the student eligibility criteria for the program.
- Award amount determined by the institution

UNC Tuition Grant

- The 2005 North Carolina General Assembly amended the 2003 NC General Assembly legislation that created the North Carolina School of Science and Mathematics Tuition Grant. During November 2021, legislative action added graduates of the UNC School of the Arts' high school.
- The grant provides encouragement and financial assistance to graduates of the NC School of Science and Mathematics (NCSSM) and the UNC School of the Arts (UNCSA) who will be attending one of the 16 UNC System institutions.
- Eligibility:
 - Be a graduate of the NCSSM or UNCSA (appropriate school year)
 - Be a NC resident, meet the requirements for in-state tuition (RDS)
 - Enroll as full-time undergraduate student at an UNC System institution during AY immediately following high school graduation
 - Complete the FAFSA, effective 2024-25
 - ~~(SAI & Title IV eligibility confirmation required)~~

UNC Tuition Grant

Value – equal to the institution's cost of standard in-state full-time undergraduate tuition (no fees included)

The grant is **renewable** for three additional academic years (a total of eight fulltime equivalent terms) provided the recipient continuously meets all eligibility requirements of the program.

Effective with the 2023 legislative action of the NC General Assembly, Tuition Grant recipients can receive program funding to assist with the cost of tuition for studies during **summer** terms. (effective summer 2024)

Application (intake form) opens on NCSEAA's MyPortal during March and closes June 30

Other NCSEAA Programs

NC Federal Matching Work Study Program

An annual funding allotment is provided to UNC System institutions to assist with the 25% non-federal share requirement of the Federal Work Study Program (primary) and/or to assist with the university's general budget for student employment (secondary)

NC Reach (Child Welfare Postsecondary Support Program)

- Overseen by NC Division of Social Services (DSS); (NCSEAA is the Fiscal Agent)
- Eligibility requirements
 - Have aged out of NC public foster care or
 - Adopted from foster care after age twelve
- Age 18 – 25 and meet criteria above
- Enroll at least half-time in a NC Community College or UNC System school, seeking a diploma, certificate or undergraduate degree
- Not be in default or owe a refund under any federal or State loan or grant program
- Maximum value: Cost of Attendance minus other aid
- Application and additional information: ncreach.org



NCSEAA Short Term Programs

The Washington Center Internship Scholarship

Program is administered by The Washington Center for Internships and Academic Seminars and SEAA.

- The award is granted to students who qualify as a resident for tuition purposes.
- Students must be undergraduate in their second year or higher in a constituent institution of The University of North Carolina to attend a semester or summer term internship program or a shortened one-to-four-week public policy and career readiness seminar program at The Washington Center located in Washington D.C.
- NCSEAA receives an invoice from The Washington Center and NCSEAA pays the funds to The Washington Center on behalf of the enrolled students.

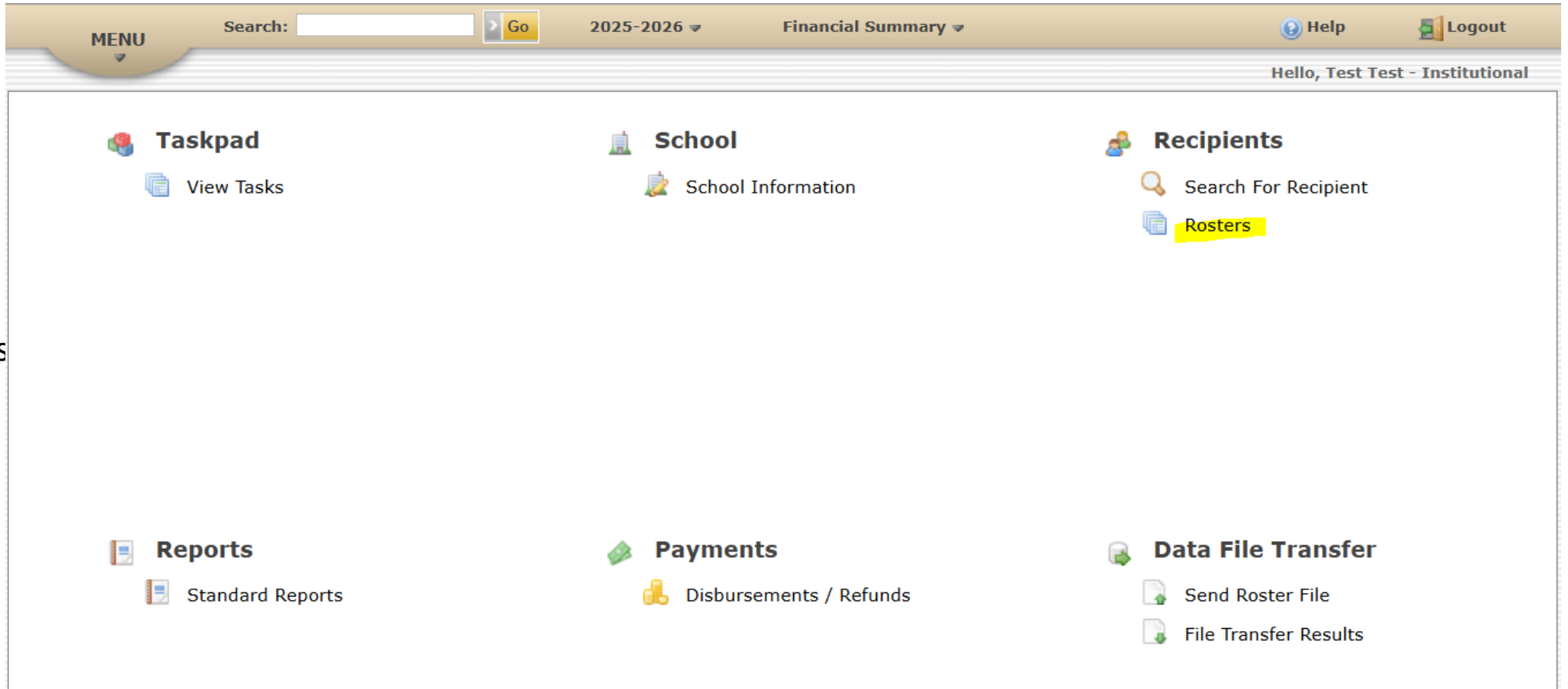

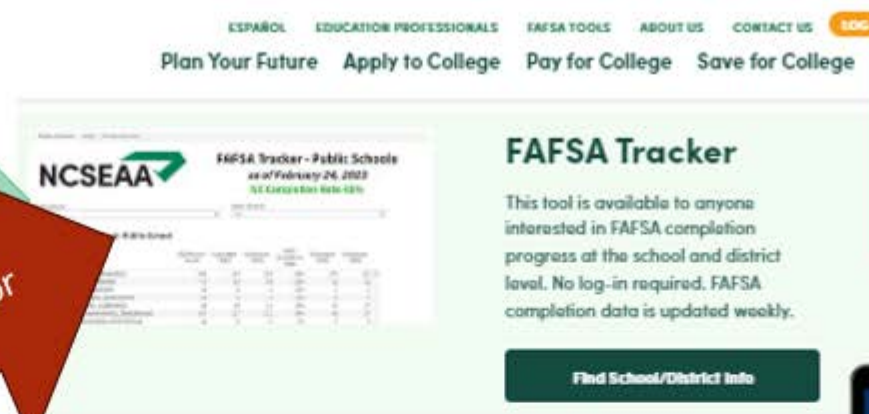

shows high school seniors' FAFSA completions by school district and individual schools

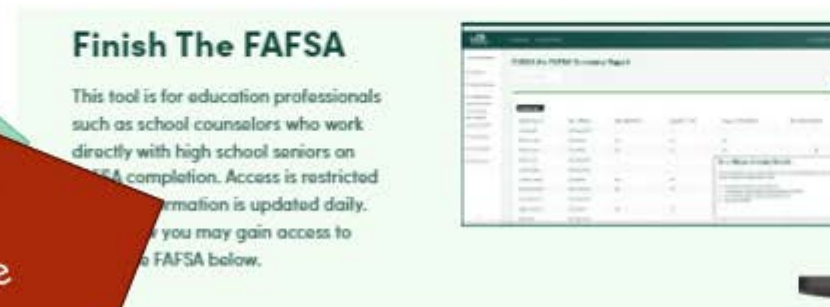
